#### Public Expression

Chair Pauli explained that anything not currently on the agenda may be discussed at this time, however no action could be taken. She further advised that comments would be welcome throughout the meeting.

## **Commissioner Reports**

a. <u>Report from the Upper Russian River Stewardship Alliance regarding frost water use</u>— Commissioner Talso reported that the RVCWD is having to do a major renovation at the its Lake Mendocino tower as two of the pumps are failing which should cost around \$100,000 to replace.

b. <u>Eel/Russian River Commission meeting update</u>—No report.

c. <u>North Coast Quagga/Zebra Mussel Prevention Consortium update</u>—This prevention program is now funded for 365 days a year.

d. <u>Update regarding actions and discussion of the state water bond issues</u>—White discussed water system bond money that is available for disadvantaged community (DACs) water agencies in our area.

e. <u>Report on the Upper Russian River Water Agency JPA</u>—At the last meeting, the RRFCD withdrew from the JPA as they felt their agency didn't really fit the JPA precepts, but they wish to continue a strong liaison with the members of the JPA.

f. <u>Report on Upper Russian River Water Manager's meeting</u>—The next scheduled meeting has been cancelled.

g. <u>Discussion of ground water rights & Sustainable Groundwater Mgmt Act (SGMA)</u>— Commissioner Carre Brown reported that they discussed a member agency assessment of \$3,000 that should cover two years of administrative costs. There also was a presentation on the Sustainability Goals. The next meeting will be in May.

h. <u>City of Ukiah purple pipe recycled water program</u>—White reported that they performed a test run of the system to the purple pipe customers and everything performed well.

j. <u>CalCannabis regulation and related issues</u>—No report.

## **Potter Valley Project**

a. Status report and discussion of the Two-Basin Partnership efforts to license the Potter Valley <u>Project</u>—Chair Pauli reported that we received a donation check for \$7,500 from the Russian River Property Owners Association. She has spoken to the group several times regarding the PVP process.

## U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Feasibility Study on Coyote Dam

a. <u>Report on Lake Mendocino water levels and conditions at Coyote Valley Dam</u>—No report.

b. <u>Discussion of Feasibility Study (FS)</u>—Chair Pauli reported that IWPC has sent out a informational letter regarding the draft termination letter from the Corps to several of our legislature representatives. Carre Brown hand delivered the Corps letter to Congressman Huffman. She reported that his response to the possibility of the Feasibility Study being terminated was very negative. We have not yet received a signed final letter from the Corps.

c. Discussion of grant funding for the FS-No report.

d. <u>Progress on Huffman's Forecast Informed Reservoir Operations bill</u>— We have not had much rain and yet Lake Mendocino is still at 741 feet which is only 7 feet down from full due to using the FIRO process. In years past at this same time, the lake levels were 20 feet down.

a. <u>Executive Committee and/or Public Policy Facilitating Committee Reports</u>—The PPFC meeting was cancelled due to the Corona Virus threat.
